

Trash (weekly), Recycle (bi-monthly)

Trash is picked up on Mondays in the alleys. Recycle, blue bins, are picked up **every-other** Monday. The recycle bins must be rolled to the front curb. Do not leave bags or boxes next to receptacles—they will not be picked up. Be sure to pull the receptacles back on to your property after pick up. Unruly Gatherings: What constitutes an "unruly gathering"? The ordinance defines it as "a gathering of five (5) or more persons on any private property (including property used to conduct business) in a manner which causes a disturbance of the quiet enjoyment of private or public property by any person or persons." This can be any time of day. Disturbances include and are generally, but not limited to, consumption of

alcohol by minors, fighting, disturbing the peace, and littering. See the JPNA website:

Caution! Parking in JP: There are "Permit Only" signs along many streets, with restricted



parking. Most are M-F 8am -5pm. In addition to parking in the Permit Only zones, other parking violations include: parking too close to stop signs, parking the wrong way, and parking too close to the driveway curb cuts (must be 5' from cut). Illegal parking in permitted zones should be called in to Park Tucson at 520-791-5071 or email: parktucson@tucsonaz.gov. City of Tucson Traffic Enforcement patrols our neighborhood on a regular basis, and issues citations.

Neighborhood Points of Interest

- ◆ Little Free Library corner of Lester and Vine against the purple wall.
- ◆ **Street Signs** designating the Historic District designed and paid for by Jefferson Park residents.
- ◆ Traffic Circles designed by JP residents, funded by a grant written by JP residents .
- ◆ Vine Ave Water Harvesting funded by grants written by neighbors and volunteer labor.
- ◆ Edison Plaza parklet at Edison and Campbell Avenue, maintained by JP volunteers through the Adopt a Park program.



◆ City Park – Play basketball etc. at the International School playground after hours. After hours and on weekends it is a city park-a gate will be unlocked.

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Jefferson Park – Federal Historic District and NPZ Protecting and Preserving...

Building in Jefferson Park — Jefferson Park, in addition to being an historic district, is also a "Neighborhood Preservation Zone", NPZ, which is an overlay zone giving our neighborhood special protections. 
